iTunes: Disabling Device Backups

Issue the following command after your first device is configured and is backed up. Disable backups to prevent other iOS devices from backing up each time they are connected to iTunes.

defaults write com.apple.iTunes DeviceBackupsDisabled -bool true

AppStore Volume Purchase Program

The first step of the Volume Purchase Program is to enroll as a **Program Manager (PM)** http://edu-vpp.apple.com/asvpp.html Once the Program Manager set up is complete the Program Manager will create **Program Facilitators (PF)**.

Program Facilitator (PF)

The Program Facilitator is a new account type for individuals in your institution. There is no limit to the number of Program Facilitators in you institution. The **Program Facilitator(s)** redeem Volume Vouchers through the App Store Volume Purchase Program Portal http://volume.itunes.apple.com/us/store . **Program Facilitators** search for apps, and may order apps in variable quantities, up to the current dollar amount credited to their account via redeemed Volume Vouchers.

The institution's **Program Facilitator(s)** may be anyone designated by the **Program Manager**. It may be a dean, a professor, a school principal, or a teacher. These individuals will be able to redeem Volume Vouchers and purchase codes for applications to be redeemed by iTunes end-users. Each Program Facilitator requires a unique account for the App Store Volume Purchase Program. These accounts will NOT be able to access the iTunes Store to download applications, music, or any other content. We recommend that, for these new Program Facilitator accounts, you create new, generic email addresses for use only with this program (e.g. vppapps@school.edu). This will ensure that even if a specific Program Facilitator transitions away from their current position, your institution will be able to transfer that account to a new Program Facilitator with minimal delay or hassle.

After purchasing apps in the App Store Volume Purchase Program portal, the Program Facilitator will have a app-specific codes for each purchase (e.g. 20 Apps 20 codes). These codes are then distributed to end- users for redemption at the iTunes App Store. Terms and conditions apply.
